Reminder: MIPS 2023 Data Submission is Open



CMS opened data submission for Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS) eligible clinicians who participated in the 2023 performance year of the Quality Payment Program (QPP). Data can be submitted and updated until <u>8:00 p.m. ET on April 1, 2024.</u>



How to Submit and Review Your 2023 MIPS Data

Follow the steps outlined below to submit data:

- 1. Go to the **Quality Payment Program sign in page**.
- 2. Sign in using your QPP access credentials.
- 3. Submit your MIPS data for the 2023 performance year or review the data reported on your behalf by a third party. (You can't correct errors with your data after the submission period, so it's important to make sure the data submitted on your behalf is accurate.)

The new site aims to enhance understanding of value-based care (VBC) as a cornerstone of transforming health care with helpful information for both the public and health care providers.

In value-based care, doctors and other health care providers work together to manage a person's overall health, while considering an individual's personal health goals. The "value" in value-based care refers to what an individual values most.


