Reminder: One Month Remaining to Request 2021 MIPS Targeted Review

If you participated in the Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS) in 2021, your performance feedback, including your MIPS final score and payment adjustment factor(s), is available on the [Quality Payment Program website](#).

For MIPS eligible clinicians, your 2021 final score determines the payment adjustment you'll receive in 2023, with a positive, negative, or neutral payment adjustment being applied to the Medicare paid amount for covered professional services furnished in 2023. MIPS eligible clinicians, groups, virtual groups and Alternative Payment Model (APM) Entities (along with their designated support staff or authorized third party intermediary) may request that CMS review the calculation of their MIPS payment adjustment factor(s) through a process called targeted review.

WHEN TO REQUEST A TARGETED REVIEW

If you believe there's an error in the calculation of your MIPS payment adjustment factor(s), you can request a targeted review until October 21, 2022. Some examples of previous targeted review circumstances include the following:

- Data was submitted under the wrong Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN) or National Provider Identifier (NPI)
- Eligibility and special status issues (e.g., you fall below the low-volume threshold and shouldn't receive a payment adjustment)
- Performance categories weren't automatically reweighted even though you qualify for reweighting due to extreme and uncontrollable circumstances

HOW TO REQUEST A TARGETED REVIEW

You can access your MIPS final score and performance feedback and request a targeted review:

- Sign in using your HCQIS Access Roles and Profile (HARP) system credentials; these are the same credentials that allowed you to submit your 2021 MIPS data
- Click "Targeted Review" on the left-hand navigation

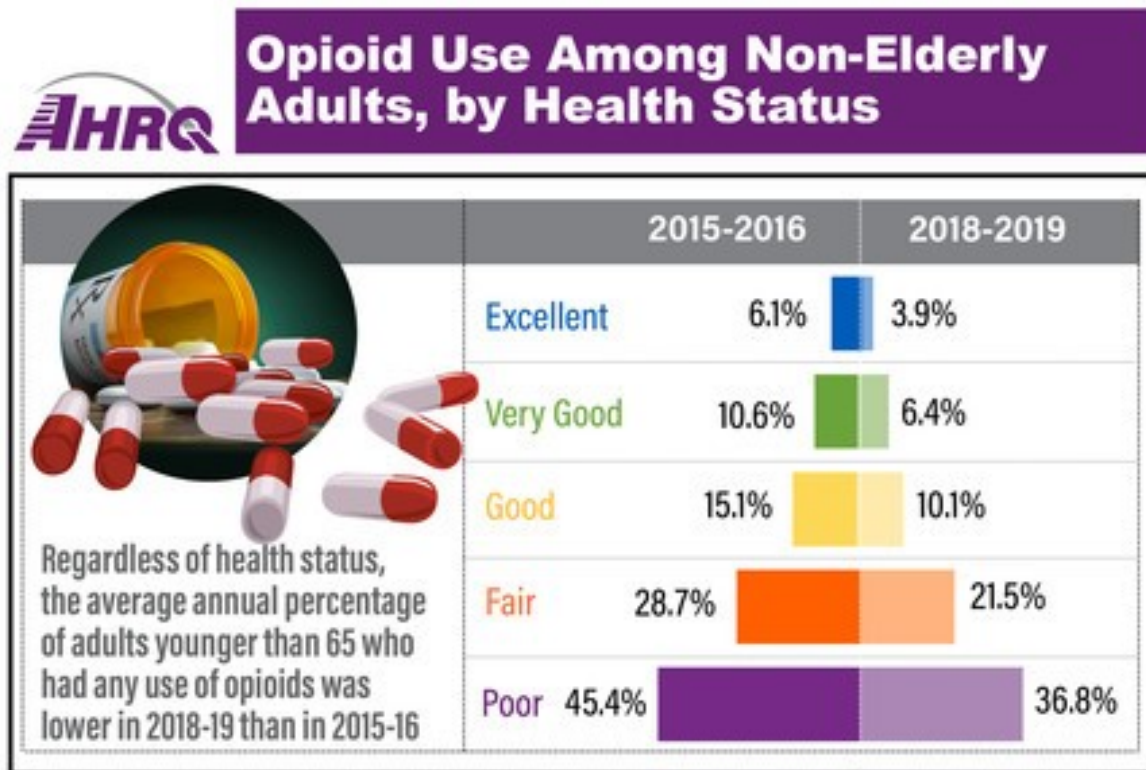

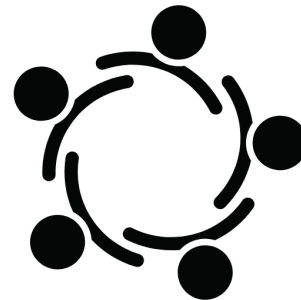
Our consortium, the **Southcentral Consortium for Overdose Prevention and Education in Oklahoma (SCOPE-OK)**, will focus on seven counties - *Bryan, Carter, Garvin, Johnston, Love, Marshall, and Murray*. We meet quarterly from 10am - 12pm at the Ardmore Public Library in person the second month of every quarter.

Our certified trainers can train anyone on naloxone use or stigma of substance use disorders.
