OFMQ Awarded GusNIP Grant to Improve Food Security





Forty-three awards make up a <u>\$20.7 million Produce</u> <u>Prescription Program</u> investment through USDA's American Rescue Plan funding for the GusNIP program. Among the 43 FY22 Produce Prescription Program proposals awarded, 95% are first-time applicants to the GusNIP Produce Prescription Program, and 60% are new entries to NIFA overall. In addition, \$38.7 million will support eight GusNIP Nutrition Incentive projects.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced an investment of \$59.4 million to support the Gus Schumacher Nutrition Incentive Program's (GusNIP) Produce Prescription and Nutrition Incentive programs designed to encourage families and individuals to eat more healthfully by increasing access to fresh fruits and vegetables. This investment delivers on a commitment made in the Biden-Harris Administration's National Strategy on Hunger, Nutrition, and Health to improve access to healthy and affordable food.






Medicare Promoting Interoperability

What You Need to Know: The New 2023 CEHRT Requirements for the Medicare Promoting Interoperability Program

CMS wants to remind Medicare Promoting Interoperability Program participants about certified electronic health record (EHR) technology (CEHRT) requirements, which begins in



calendar year (CY) 2023.

To be considered a meaningful user and avoid a downward payment adjustment, eligible hospitals and critical access hospitals (CAHs) attesting to the Medicare Promoting Interoperability Program will be required to only use certified health IT that has been updated consistent with the 2015 Edition Cures Update criteria to successfully meet the CEHRT requirements.

The Doctors and Clinicians Preview Period is officially open as of November 21, 2022. You can now preview your 2021 Quality Payment Program (QPP) performance information before it will appear on clinician and group profile pages on <u>Medicare Care Compare</u> and in the Provider Data Catalog (<u>PDC</u>).
