No. 1 Target for Ransomware Threats

Healthcare is now under constant threat of cybersecurity attacks and the statistics are astonishing! A study in December from the <u>JAMA Health Forum</u> reports the annual number of healthcare ransomware attacks **more than doubled** from 2016 to 2021, exposing the protected health information of over 41 million patients. In 2022, up to 210 healthcare organizations fell victim to ransomware attacks and with the per incident cost of a healthcare data breach reaching \$10.10 million, making it the top industry for most expensive breach <u>costs</u>.

Human Services' Office for Civil Rights (OCR) announced a settlement with Banner Health **Affiliated Covered Entities** ("Banner Health"), a nonprofit health system headquartered in Phoenix, Arizona, to resolve a data breach resulting from a hacking incident by a threat actor in 2016 which disclosed the protected health information of 2.81 million consumers. The settlement is regarding the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) Security Rule which works to help protect health information and data from cybersecurity attacks.



The potential violations specifically include: the lack of an analysis to determine risks and vulnerabilities to electronic protected health information across the organization, insufficient monitoring of its health information systems' activity to protect against a cyberattack, failure to implement an authentication process to safeguard its electronic protected health information, and failure to have security measures in place to protect electronic protected health information from unauthorized access when it was being transmitted electronically.

As a result, Banner Health paid \$1,250,000 to OCR and agreed to implement a corrective action plan, which identifies steps Banner Health will take to resolve these potential violations of the HIPAA Security Rule and protect the security of electronic patient health information.

On March 29, 2023, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration approved Narcan, 4 milligram (mg) naloxone hydrochloride nasal spray for over-the-counter (OTC), nonprescription, use – the first naloxone product approved for use without a prescription. Naloxone is a medication that rapidly reverses the effects of opioid overdose and is the standard treatment for opioid overdose. This action paves the way for the life-saving medication to reverse an opioid overdose to be sold directly to consumers in places like drug stores, convenience stores, grocery stores and gas stations, as well as online.



A new ONC report to Congress updating progress on the access, exchange, and use of electronic health information (EHI) is now available.


