The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) proposed two important new rules in December 2022 which, if finalized, would advance electronic health information exchange and streamline cumbersome health care processes by establishing standardized requirements across the industry. These rules reflect the deep collaboration between CMS and ONC to ensure that providers and payers adopt common, open-industry standards to advance interoperability and industry innovation.

SCOPE-OK seeks to understand community attitudes and beliefs about substance use disorders (SUD). Stigma regarding SUD, or negative beliefs and/or attitudes about people who experience addiction, is common at both the individual and system levels and can make recovery more difficult.

Through a multi-year initiative supported by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), OFMQ has developed a consortium to identify and address barriers to the prevention, treatment, and recovery of opioid and methamphetamine use disorders. Our consortium, the Southcentral Consortium for Overdose Prevention and Education in Oklahoma (SCOPE-OK), will focus on seven counties - Bryan, Carter, Garvin, Johnston, Love, Marshall, and Murray.
